PURPOSE

- a) To teach with each student's learning style in mind. We will evaluate each student's modality to determine whether it is visual, auditory, kinesthetic or a combination, and plan lessons accordingly.
- b) To discover each child's academic strengths and weaknesses. We will evaluate each student upon entrance into our program. An educational plan will be devised for each child that takes into account individual needs. Goals for academic progress include striving for over half of the students to make 1.1 year's progress in a year, and that 80% of ESE students reach 80% of their IEP Goals.
- c) To allow each child to progress as far as their academic ability will take them in their areas of strength and show at least 80% comprehension in all other academic areas. We will use the unit method of teaching for most subjects. Each unit created will include a variety of learning activities geared toward each style of learning. Also, each unit will provide a continuum of projects and assignments so that there will be a base requirement for the 80% criterion, and the availability of enrichment as well so that each child will be challenged to excel.
- d) To encourage character development. Each month a character

- trait will be emphasized and incorporated into the units taught, so that practical application of concepts such as persistence (Thomas Edison and the light bulb), diligence (George Washington Carver and the Tuskagee Institute), and so on, will be taught.
- e) To help children develop in emotional and social areas. Applied Behavioral Analysis will be utilized where necessary to devise individual behavior plans that would allow for growth and success in behavior, anger management, peer interactions, responses to authority and skill acquisition.
- f) To encourage an environment of health, fitness and nutrition. Healthy eating will be required and an individualized nutrition and physical activity plan will be developed and encouraged whenever necessary. Each child will be encouraged to personalize these ideals in order to help him/her develop lifelong good health habits. Use of EEG-biofeedback and the Smart Moves program will be incorporated for the purpose of finetuning focus and building neuropathways.
- g) To encourage parent involvement and a partnership between the home and the school. A home visit will be conducted prior to the first day of school so that the home environment will be taken into account when evaluating the student's abilities and developing an

- individual learning program. An atmosphere of professionalism and advocacy for the child between teacher and parents will be expected. Support for the family system will be provided through monthly parent meetings where parents will be encouraged in the areas of academics, behavior, nutrition and fitness, parenting, community resources for their child and family counseling referrals if desired.
- To provide a positive learning environment which will enhance the learning experience and help the student develop a good self-concept and a sense of personal worth. Teachers will model trust in the authority structure, belief in one's abilities and a sense of purpose in life. These qualities will be encouraged in the children as well. We expect our students will develop the ability to be good citizens in their community, will be friendly classmates, productive and loving member of their family and, eventually, successful members of society.
- i) Hope children will have the opportunity to become peer mentors for Hope's autistic students, becoming involved in friendships that will be mutually beneficial.
